This team of worthy green warriors have been tasked with the greening of Turvey Park Public School and will achieve this by:

- * Monitoring food scrap caddies (kindly donated by Wagga Wagga City Council) which are used in all classrooms, staffrooms, the office and the canteen.
- * Introducing FOGO bins for food scraps in the playground and helping to make sure that they are used appropriately.
- * Return and Earn bins to raise money for playground equipment.
- * Reducing plastic waste by introducing the War on Waste program which encourages families to think creatively about lunchbox options by providing each student with a Bento box style lunch box.
- * Developing and maintaining a kitchen garden for the whole school to enjoy. We have been successful recipients of several grants and donations, which will enable this project to begin later in the year.
- * Planning and developing more green spaces in the playground so that students can learn outside and connect with nature.

Good morning TPPS families

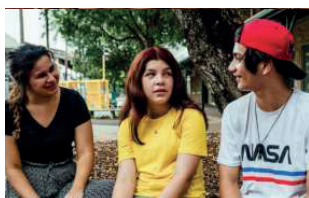
